

Leadership Los Gatos is a program for people of all backgrounds and interests who wish to become more involved in the community. Its mission is to engage, educate and develop service-oriented individuals who live and/or work in Los Gatos for leadership roles in community and neighborhood organizations,



Leadership Los Gatos provides insight into the community and how it works. The Town of Los Gatos and the Chamber of Commerce invest significant resources to this program to ensure it is successful in developing future leaders.

The program provides a comprehensive overview of the infrastructure in Los Gatos and the decision-making processes that shape Los Gatos. Through Leadership Los Gatos, you will learn to appreciate that, when evaluating alternatives, there is often 'no right answer' and to see the differing and diverse perspectives of each stakeholder group. Each monthly session has a specific focus that, in total, will deepen your understanding of how Los Gatos works. The community realizes this value by having graduates participate in the decision making process within Los Gatos and the Silicon Valley.

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Leadership Los Gatos sessions are held on the *first Friday* of each month from October through June with the exception of January and this year the final session will be held on the last Friday in May. Classes begin at 8:30 a.m. with a continental breakfast and are followed by a 9:00 a.m. program .All sessions include lunch and conclude by 2:00 p.m., unless otherwise noted.

Meeting locations vary and will be announced prior to the session.

Leadership Los Gatos discussion topics include, but are not limited to:

- Leadership Development
- Role of Town Government in the Community
- Presentation and Communication Skills, Negotiation, & Meeting Leadership
- Land Use and Economic Vitality
- Ethical Decision Making
- Local Infrastructure and Resident-Serving Utilities, Sustainability
- Public Safety, Cyber security Technology and Disaster Preparedness

Class participants are required to complete a variety of assignments, such as:

- Attend a Town Council Meeting and other public meetings
- Participate in a Los Gatos/Monte Sereno Police ride-along
- Participate in a Class Volunteer Project

APPLICATION, TUITION, AND FEES

The application and tuition deadline for the 2014/15 Leadership Los Gatos program is Friday, *August 29, 2014.* The tuition for the 2014/2015 Leadership Los Gatos program is \$400 per participant. Tuition received after August 29 will increase to \$450. Applicants will be notified of their acceptance status no later than Friday, September 12. Applicants not accepted to the program will receive a full tuition refund.

A minimum of 15 participants is needed for the class to proceed.

Priority is given to those who live and/or work within Town limits.

Applications are screened by a selection committee to balance professional and community interests. Class size is limited to ensure quality class sessions and full participation by all participants.

Please carefully evaluate your availability to commit before applying to the program, as termination will result with no refund of the program tuition if you:
